Select Security was able to move our facilities and UL-Listed Central Monitoring Station seamlessly to ensure uninterrupted monitoring and protection of the homes and businesses we serve.

Select Security's President, Patrick Egan, had stated previously that, "We had several opportunities to move out of the city...but we preferred to remain within Lancaster." Select Security is very excited about the growth and activity going on in Lancaster City, and pleased that Select Security maintains its headquarters here.

Relocation was an ambitious task, and moving our facility within 110 days was nothing short of a miracle. Thanks to the hardworking and conscientious employees at Caldwell, Heckles and Egan, Inc., based in Lancaster, PA, coordination of the \$1.5M in renovations went smoothly.

CH&E coordinated the addition of a 1,000 AMP electrical service, twin 150KW generators connected to a 600AMP transfer system, an elevator and sprinkler system, and over 30 tons air conditioning. More than 16,000 sq. ft. of office space was renovated to Class A status, and we completed our renovations with a newly paved parking lot and security fence.

Select Security officially started working at its new facility on October 8, 2007, but for a short time maintained two separate monitoring stations to ensure that its thousands of monitored customers were never without service. Because the company monitors signals from fire and intrusion detection systems, and because of the importance of real time notification of any alarm signals, it is important that readiness was always maintained.
